On Saturday, February 2 your regional Presidents and Board of Directors met at Roadsters & Ragtops Restoration Shop (thanks Mike Engard and Rick Broader). The main

discussion was, of course, the Flash going electronic, finally, and being delivered via e-mail as it was done in January. The Club has been trying to move the Flash electronically for the past few years for four reasons:

- 1) Faster delivery
- 2) Color photos
- 3) More pages and articles
- 4) To save money

By going electronic, we hope to reduce membership dues or better yet provide each region with more money. Right now, printing and mailing the Flash costs you \$11,000 of the Club's roughly \$17,000 operating expenses (that's 64%). Our goal is to reduce that expense and provide each region President with more money to use for local events for you. We could also reduce dues.

Most members have been asking for the Flash to go electronic and most of us belong to other clubs that distribute their newsletters via e-mail, and we print them out if we want to keep them. Some people have told me they save the newsletters electronically.

Let me add another perhaps more important reason to go electronic: RESOURCES.
Global warming is real, and we are causing it.
Ink, printing electricity, paper, mailing, trucks, and mailmen are not helping and then you recycle the Flash after a 15 minute reading. Come on, at some point we have to realize that the things we do are having a negative impact. Is the paper Flash, over 60,000 printed pages a year, through the mail really worth it?

THE AHSTC BOARD NEEDS YOUR HELP. I need your help.

The Board has asked you if you want edelivery or paper and we have not heard from all of you. Over the past year, about half have said they want e-delivery and no paper, and half printed Flash.

The Club will still make paper copies available by mail to members who do not have internet or a printer or do not want to be bothered printing it or going online. But the Flash may not be in the folded-over "booklet/magazine" format it is in now. It could be a double sided Xerox copy.

I, Steve Jekogian, the guy who has every copy of the Flash printed, told Nigel to take me off the mailing list. I ONLY WANT ELECTRONIC FLASH. Yes, I will save the Club money and the world pollution. How about you?

Please e-mail me or your President NOW and tell him YES, I WANT ONLY ELECTRONIC FLASH. If we get enough members that demand/want electronic Flash, Nigel suggested issuing a really nice end of summer/Encounter wrap-up collectable color **printed** Flash with lots of pictures of your cars and events. So vote now.

Well I am a bit behind on my Flash article for the month, but I'm now sitting though a day of jury duty which may give me some much needed time to catch up. Nothing like sitting in a juror lounge full of people wondering how the day will unfold.

Anyway, much going on for this time of the year. Unfortunately, my wife and I missed this year's regional holiday party because she was rather sick at the time of the party. Reports were of a relaxing, low-key evening with a nice showing of members and some great food (and drink)! We'll certainly be back next year and some day hope to have our home in a reasonable state of reconstruction/restoration to be able to actually host the event!

Barrett-Jackson just wrapped up and I must admit that I didn't get into the TV coverage as I have in prior years. The event was even feeling a bit passé to me and the cars looking somewhat redundant. I probably can't be objective though, as I don't foresee BJ-type vehicles ever in my garage (6-figure hot-rods not on my must-have list!). Reports that I've heard indicate that prices are down from prior years. I imagine there are a number of factors influencing the reported decline which may just be a reflection of the overall state of the economy. I also heard that the coolest vehicle at auction was the "Monkey-mobile". Unfortunately, I didn't see that vehicle at auction and wasn't exposed to the Monkey's TV show growing up so the novelty was lost on me a bit.

While Barrett-Jackson was going on, a slightly less known automotive auction was going on in Hatfield, PA at the Alderfer Auction House. Many people may have heard of this auction through online advertising, eBay live auctions or another source. The auction included over 50 vintage vehicles, all in "barn-find" condition, along with literally a barn full of car parts, engines and automotive memorabilia. The auction had been on my radar for 6 or so weeks and I made certain not to schedule any conflicting events on auction day. Auction vehicles were split between American and European. Much of the American cars were pre-1940's while the

European stuff was typically 50's and 60's.

Included on the import side were 10 Bugeyes in varying states of decay and completeness. None struck me as being particularly solid (that's being kind) although one of them was Judsonpowered. Auction prices for the Bugeves ranged from \$50 to \$2,000. Either people were seeing some hidden potential that I wasn't or I'm completely out of touch with the market as I was quite astonished at the prices that some of the cars were bringing. Also in the auction were 2 MGA's, an MG TD, 4 BMW Isettas, a Saab Sonnet, Triumph Herald, NSU Prinz, Goggomobile, and a few other vehicles that I'm undoubtedly forgetting. There were 65 lots that were simultaneously being auctioned live on eBay and online interest was high. I estimate that only about 5 or 6 of the cars ultimately sold to online bidders but most items did get some internet bids.

The highest selling item was a 1939 Ford Woody Wagon that fetched \$43,000! The Isetta's generated a tremendous amount of interest and the four combined to pull in about \$15,000 with the low-end car bringing \$2,750 and the top Isetta bringing \$5,500. The 2 MGA's may have been the bargain of the day (\$500 & \$1,100) while the TD was the most appealing car to me and sold to another bidder for \$6,500 – well above the amount I was willing (or able) to bid. I don't know that I necessarily expected to go home from the auction empty-handed, but I honestly can say that I wasn't terribly disappointed to do so.

In other automotive updates, it doesn't seem as though any of our regular monthly meeting attendees are wrenching much on Healeys this winter although that's not to say no work is being accomplished. Active member projects include a Porsche 914 racecar, 2 Jags, a Datsun 1600 racecar, an MGA, a MGTC, my Austin Mini, and probably a couple others that I'm forgetting to mention. They may not be Healeys, but rest assured our attention will turn back to the Healeys at the first sign of spring!




We'll have to wait another month to report our calendar of events for the new year. Our Events Planning meeting scheduled for January 17th was cancelled due to a last minute snow



February, (the bottom of the barrel of the driving calendar,) seems limited to recollection of the past or planning the future. The only exception is if you






