#### 2023 AHSTC Member Survey HIGHLIGHTS

In early 2023 AHSTC conducted its first member survey since 2005. The survey's intent was to elicit member information and thoughts about club activities that can be used to make our club more engaging. We do commend our members, 170 of whom responded for an excellent 63% response rate. At this response level the survey accurately represents the thinking of our membership. Your AHSTC Board of Directors and Regional officers value your opinions and with your participation fully intend to develop and implement the opportunities for improvement pointed out in the survey. Adding value to your membership is the goal.

- Member Information
  - o 86% are older than 60 years old. (No surprise here!)
  - o 61% are older than 70 years old.
  - o 38% have been members for more than 21 years.
  - o 26% have been members for less than 5 years. (Good news!)
- Healey Ownership
  - o BJ8s are most popular model (25%).
  - o Bugeyes, 100s (BN1 &BN2) and Mk I 3000s are the next most popular (14% each).
  - o Square body Sprites are owned by 10%.
  - o No Silverstones or Jensen Healeys!
- Event Preferences
  - o Members would most like more one day driving tours.
  - o More tours of restoration shops or auto museums and tech sessions also would be appreciated.
- Encounter
  - o 71% of members have attended at least one.
  - o Family/work commitments are main reason for not attending.
  - o The three most popular Encounter events are the car show, tech sessions and the rally.
  - o Location, location! 57% say it depends on location whether we should rotate among a few fixed venues. 38% say we should definitely rotate among a few venues.
  - o 72% will drive 50 miles or more to Encounter. (Top down, of course!)
- The Flash
  - o 72% open The Flash every month while 5% never open it.
  - o Favorite features are specialty articles and tech tips. We won't take it personally but the President's page and the Editor's page are the least popular.
- Regional Meetings
  - o 36% regularly attend monthly meetings.
  - o 59% say the meeting locations are convenient to them.
  - o 41% say meeting locations should rotate while almost the same number (39%) say it doesn't matter.
  - o Mid-weekdays (T-W-Th) are the most popular meeting days while weekends are the least.
  - o Most (65%) prefer a dinner meeting. (> 6PM)

  - o 63% visit our website 1-5 times a month while 37% say they never visit it.

Last month's mystery micro-car was correctly identified by a number of sharp-eyed readers as a 1959-60 NSU Prinz. It was made by the NSU Motorerenwerke AG from 1956-62. Here are some specifications:

Drivetrain Configuration: Rear engine, rear wheel drive

Engine: 583cc, 26 hp, 2 cylinder, air cooled transversely mounted

Transmission: 4 speed manual Top Speed: 62 mph (0-30 in 10 sec.) Years of Production: 1956-62 Number Produced: 94,549

Original Cost: \$1,195

Mercury astronaut, John Glenn, chose to drive a Prinz instead of driving a Corvette as his fellow astronauts did. He used the money he saved on gas on his long commute every day to help pay for his kids' college tuition. NSU claimed in their advertisements that you could "Drive a Prinz and be a King!" The Prinz was a pretty good little Autocross car in its class, and was highly regarded for its quality build and surprisingly comfortable ride. A nicely restored example goes for about \$32,000! (The somewhat forlorn example shown in the photos in last month's Flash is still available at the Co-Parts junkyard in Grantville, if anyone's interested.)




#### WORLD'S MOST FAMOUS AUSTIN HEALEY? THAT YOU NEVER HEARD OF?

But first, a little background information from long ago and far away:

fter Austin and Nuffield merged in 1952, joining Austin and MG, Morris. Riley and Wolseley, Forming British Motor Corporation, a competition department was formed in 1955 with the idea to increase sales. "Race on Sunday, sell on Monday." Initially, they entered just about every car they manufactured in competition: Morris Minors, Austin sedans, MGs. They might take a class win in racing or International rallying. None of their cars could win an event outright as all were too underpowered. The Austin Healey 100 was so named because it could reach 100 miles an hour. The engine came from the Austin A90 which was supposed to sell like hotcakes in the United States but didn't. This big four was perfect for the 100 but was soon to go out of production. A 2.6 litre six was BMC's engine to replace it. Donald Healey was none too pleased as the engine produced less horsepower than the four. Powering large sedans or saloons (as they say in England), it didn't have to produce large amounts of power. The real problem was the cylinder head. The intake manifold was cast in the head and the carbs bolted directly to the cylinder head. The later 100-6's had a new 12 port head just like the one in your Big Healey (if you have one). They cast around for a car that could win European rallies. Rallies were a big deal in Europe and were more like racing out on reads, often public roads which would be closed while competition was going on. The Healey had potential and was systematically developed into a powerful contender. Engine power was dealt with in short order. By 1960 the engine was making 180 horsepower, had 3 HD8 carbs (2" mouth), and the brakes were 4 wheel discs.

Now back to the story of the World's Most
Famous Austin Healey. It is to be auctioned off on April 16th, soon after you read this. It is a factory prepared rally car or "Works Healey", driven by Pat Moss and navigated by Ann Wisdom in the 1960 Liege-Rome-Liege Rally. Now Liege is in Belgium and Rome is in Italy but somehow the rally went to Yugoslavia before it turned around to return to end in Liege. It was called a marathon, lasting 96 hours with no scheduled stops. Maurice Garot, the organizer of the event, is reported to have said that a perfect rally would be one where no one finished. In those days, there were special awards for women as they were not considered equal to the men. Pat had some previous experience with big Healeys in rally competition and had her own ideas for improvement. She felt the 3000's were too fast for international rallies. The way they were geared would offer 120 or130 mph in overdrive with 4.1 to 1 final drive. She proposed

a differential 4.875 to 1 from a London taxi. This allowed 80 mph in fourth gear and maybe 90 in overdrive. The change would give outrageous acceleration uphill. A new improved gearbox was fitted to all the competing Healeys. The men in charge were skeptical with regard to the gearing. Pat stuck to her guns and the higher numerical gear set was installed. She worried that the engine and gearbox could not stand up to the 3000 miles of hard rally driving. 85 cars started and only 30 made it out of Yugoslavia and only 13 to the finish line. Pat said that Yugoslavia was a car killer. In summer, it was hot as hell, and anyone who has a big Healey can relate to that. The roads there were dusty and like washboards making for a very bumpy ride. The bottom of the cars would sometimes hit the road. In Pat's car, the overdrive failed in Yugoslavia and the clutch began slipping. Somehow that was



helped by shooting fire extinguisher fluid at the clutch (how was that accomplished?). They couldn't take care of the clutch until they got to France where a front input shaft seal was sourced from a local garage and installed in about one hour's time. There wasn't enough time to properly replace the transmission tunnel in the car with any of the screws. They continued on with Ann holding the gearbox cover down. They were delayed enough by all their troubles that the road was reopened with the workers

thinking there were no more cars still coming. Fortunately they got to the checkpoint in time. Near the end Pat, having driven 90 hours out of the 96, found herself driving slower and slower, unable to move faster than 30 mph. A worry for sure, but it turned out no one left was moving any faster. Pat and Ann won outright! It's a great story for Women's History Month.

I had the great pleasure of meeting Ann Wisdom (and fellow race drivers Peter Riley and John Sprinzel) at Club of America's Conclave in Kingston, Ontario in 2009. I got to hear their stories firsthand and to get their autographs on the inside of my Healey trunk lid! Unfortunately, Pat Moss passed away in October 2008.





# TAG THAT CAR!

utoBio tag it, that is. AutoBio is an innovative company that provides static-cling windshield tags for owners to display on their cars whenever, and wherever, they want, e.g., always, at car shows, at cruise nights, etc. The interesting feature is that each tag contains both a QR Code and Near Field Communication (NCF), both of which can be scanned by most cell phones. When scanned by a passer-by or admirer, they are directed to the story of your car on the AutoBio website. You write the story, include photos and get as detailed and technical as you want. No personal information is divulged (unless you place it in your story) and you can update the info at any time. I have found this to be entertaining at car shows and cruise nights, and it's a great conversation starter.




