

#### NOBODY PUTS BABY IN A CORNER - A GARAGE WILL DO!

appy Anniversary!" Pete Sauvigne said, smiling at his wife.

"Thank you", Linda replied clearly happy, but nearly oblivious to what was comming next. It was 1980 when she and Pete were celebrating their 10th wedding anniversary while standing in a parking lot at a restaurant in Newport, VA. They were next to a beautiful Austin-Healey 3000, which Linda immediately went over to admire. Linda always loved Big Healeys, and it was one of the first things Pete got to know about her after they first met.

"Happy Anniversary!" Pete repeated. Linda looked questioningly at her husband, and then again at the car; she remained silent and confused, that is until he handed her the keys and started to take the top down.

Specifically, this was a 1962 Austin-Healey 3000 Mark II BT7. Linda soon was calling her Healey "Baby", and it became as if part of the family. Linda drove it regularly and happily as she first loved it, but when the Sauvignes settled in retirement in Pennsylvania, they decided to have "Baby" restored. They took it to K&T Vintage Sports Cars for a full body off restoration. According to the British Motor Industry Heritage Trust factory record certificate, the car was originally Ivory White with black interior when it was exported from England to a dealer in Germany, prior to being re-exported into the USA. As a German export, the car is unique in that it had amber signal lights and white running lights built into the front shroud. Donald Healey himself examined the car in 1978 and confirmed only 28 cars were made this way in 1961 for the German market.



# AUCTION REPORT

These two Healeys couldn't be further apart on the Healey spectrum, but they both offer an insight into the market, particularly the on-line market and, in one case, a little entertainment.

At first of glance of the photos, the 1965 3000 MkIII looks like a very nice car that, while not without faults, shouldn't have any trouble selling at a reasonable price. So why did the bidding stop at a reserve not met (RNM) of \$33k?

This car was offered on a relatively new on-line website called Pcarmarket.

This may not be familiar to many of you. It's a Bring-a-Trailer copy with a few little differences. In addition, it seems to be dominated by the Porsche market, although it appears to accept any marque. So, first off, this may not have been the best venue for a Healey. Here we have a 1969 Healey Sprite with a twist, on Bring a Trailer. I apologized in advance in the What's in *The Flash* section and, as I said, I could not resist sharing this car with you.

When I first came across this car, I anticipated that it would be cutting edge and perhaps relevant in an era of electrification, including vintage cars. (Check out what the actor Robert Downey Jr. is doing with his vintage car collection on the Motor Trend channel if you can find it.) Here we have "not quite" cutting edge technology, but you must admire the effort. I'm betting this is the heaviest Sprite on the planet! And don't overlook the included, towable gasoline powered "range extender". This car was RNM (yes it had a reserve!!) at \$686.




